








Topsy and Tim and Mummy were on their way to Rosemary Farm. They were going to see Mummy's friend Mrs Stewart, the farmer's wife.














The angry geese were on the path back to the farmhouse, so Topsy and Tim could not go that way. They climbed the wall instead, being very careful with their eggs.

"Let's go back to the farmhouse this way," said Tim



Farmer Stewart took a bucket of new milk. He led Topsy and Tim to a smaller shed.



feed the calf




The calf soon discovered how to drink from the bucket without any help. Topsy and Tim ran back to the farmhouse to tell Mummy all about it.
