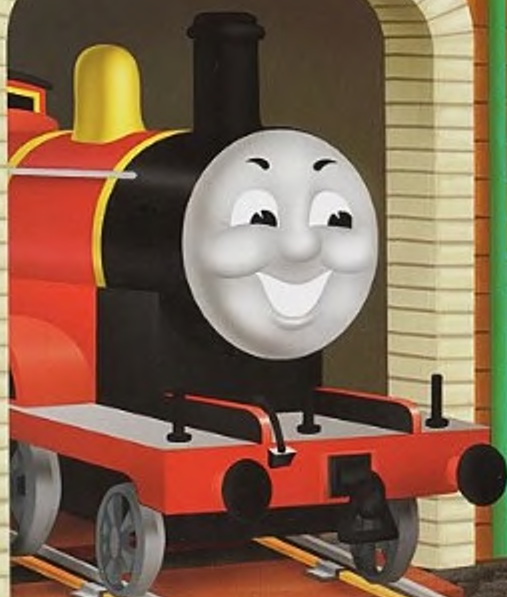

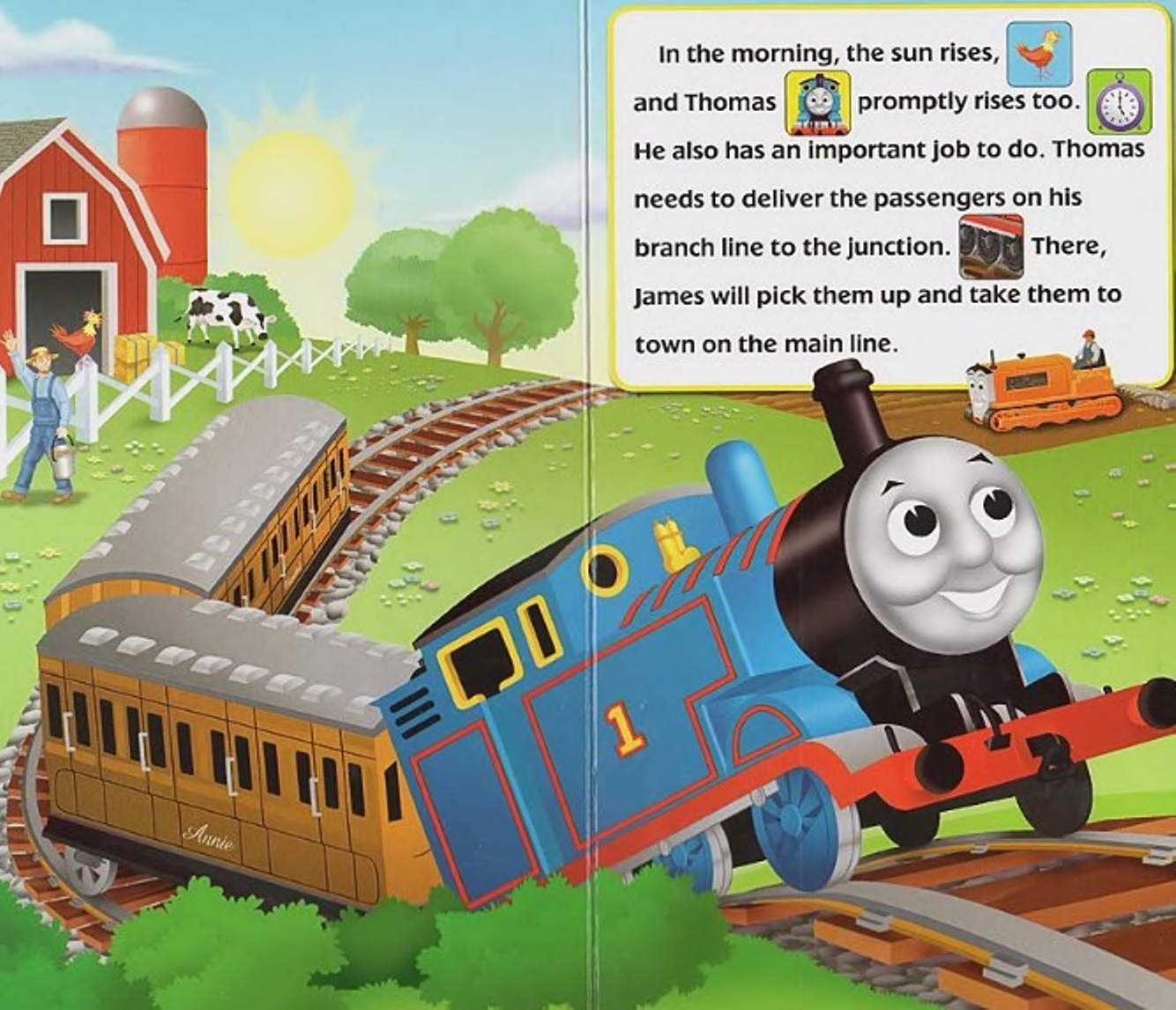






It has been a long, hard day at work, and Thomas  and Percy  are tired. But back at the engine shed, James talks and talks.

But when Thomas  gets to the station at the junction,  James is not there! He stayed up so late boasting about his special morning run that he is still in the engine shed, fast asleep. 

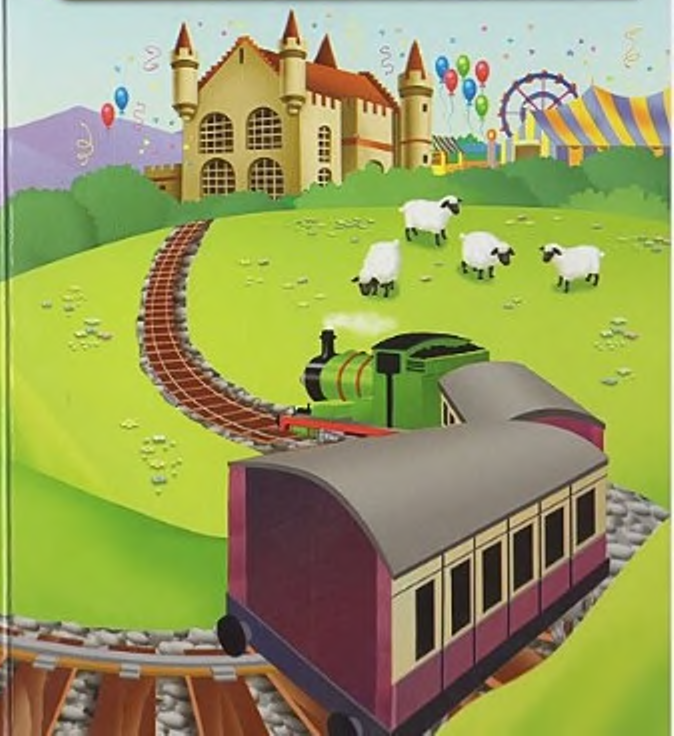


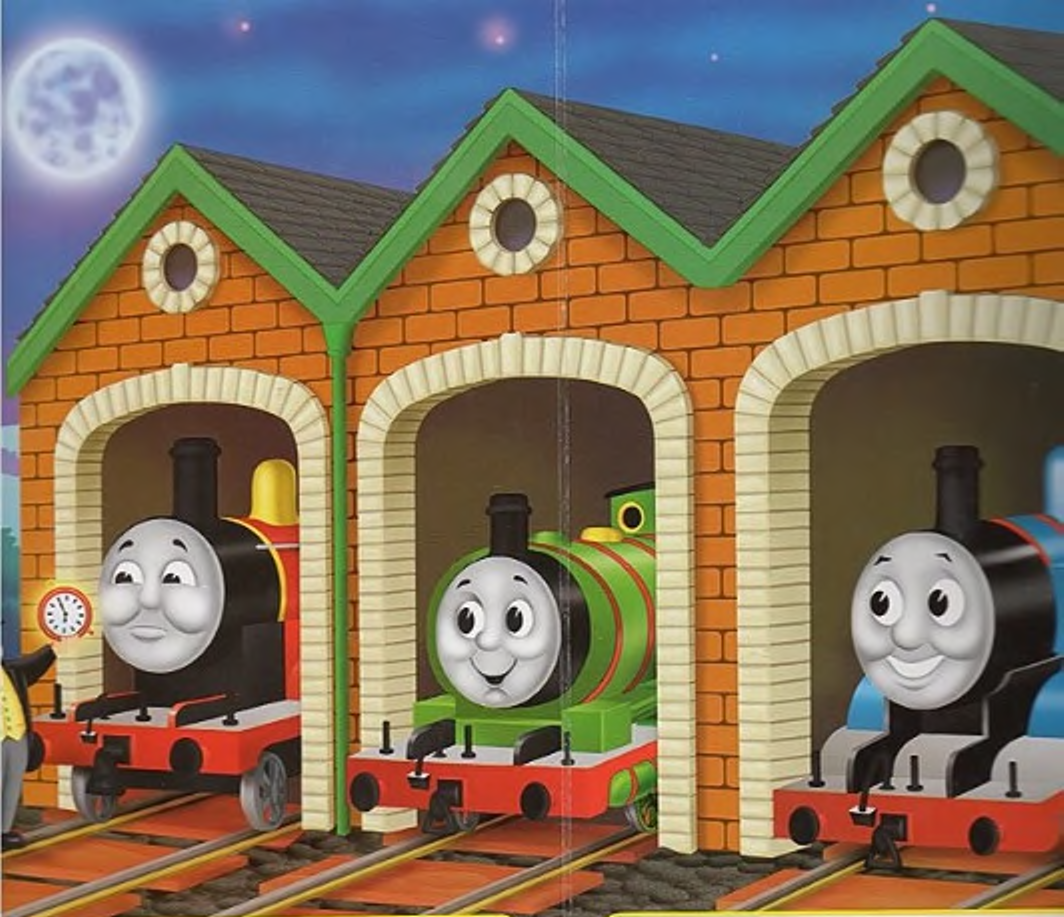
"Oh no!" says Thomas. He waits and waits but sees no sign of James. "I can't let the passengers be late for the royal parade!"
