Perry and his family lived at the South Pole.

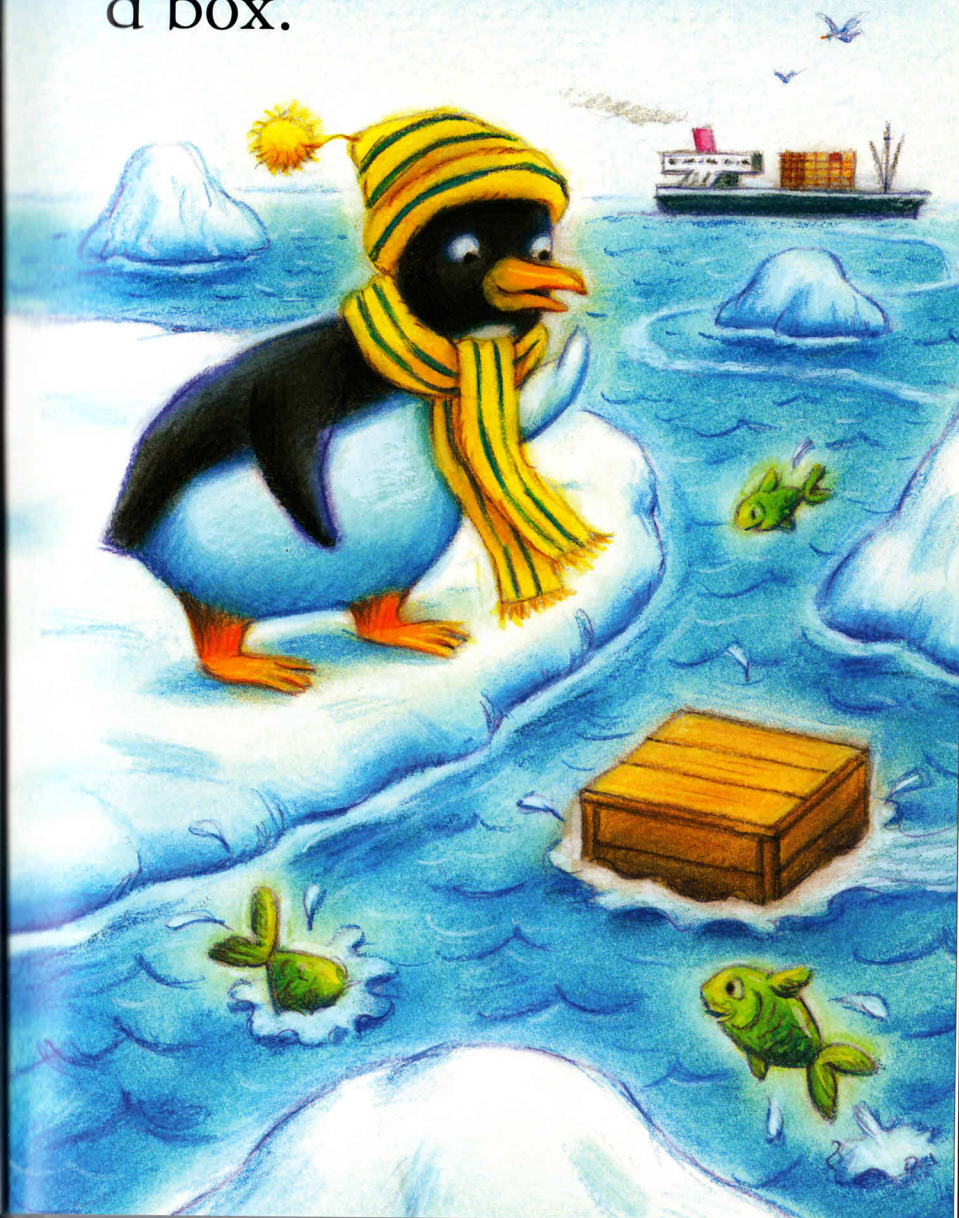




It was always

grandpa.



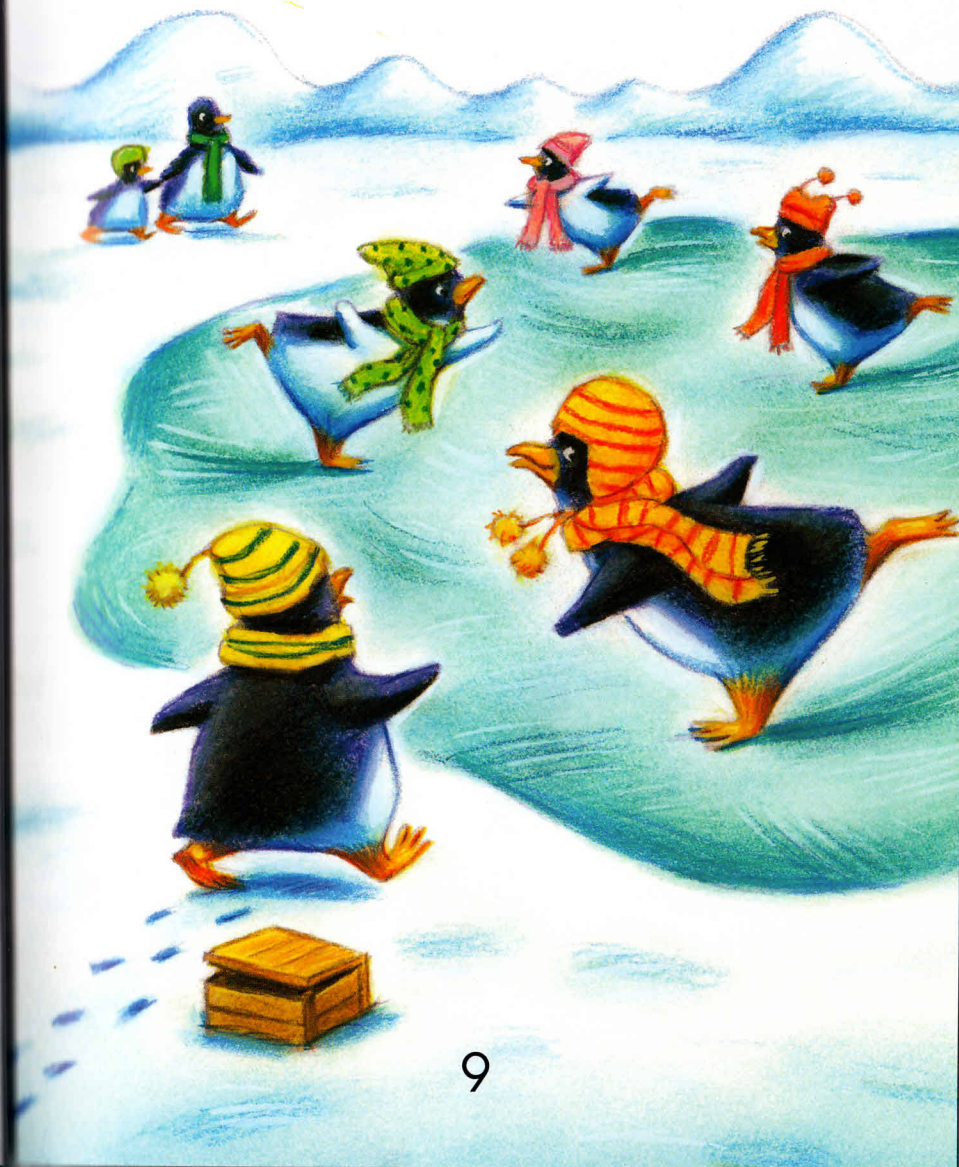
“I need to get warm,

down...



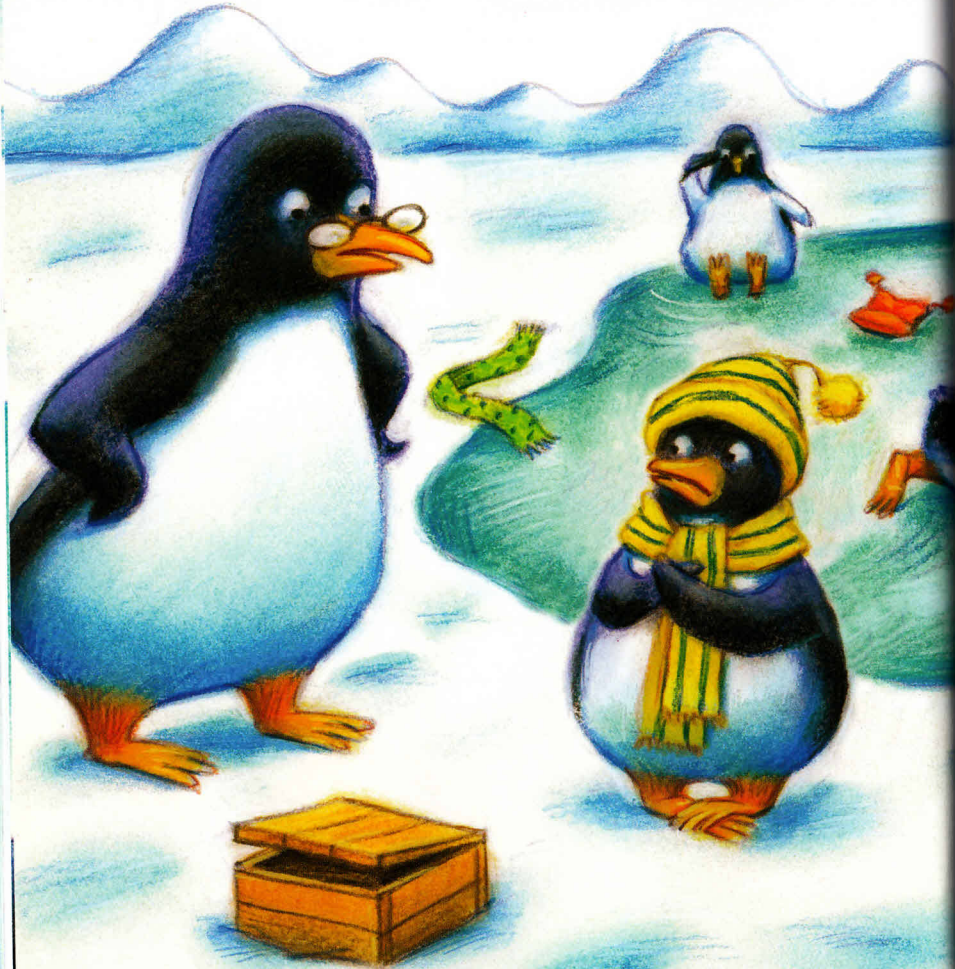
...and round and round.

evening.



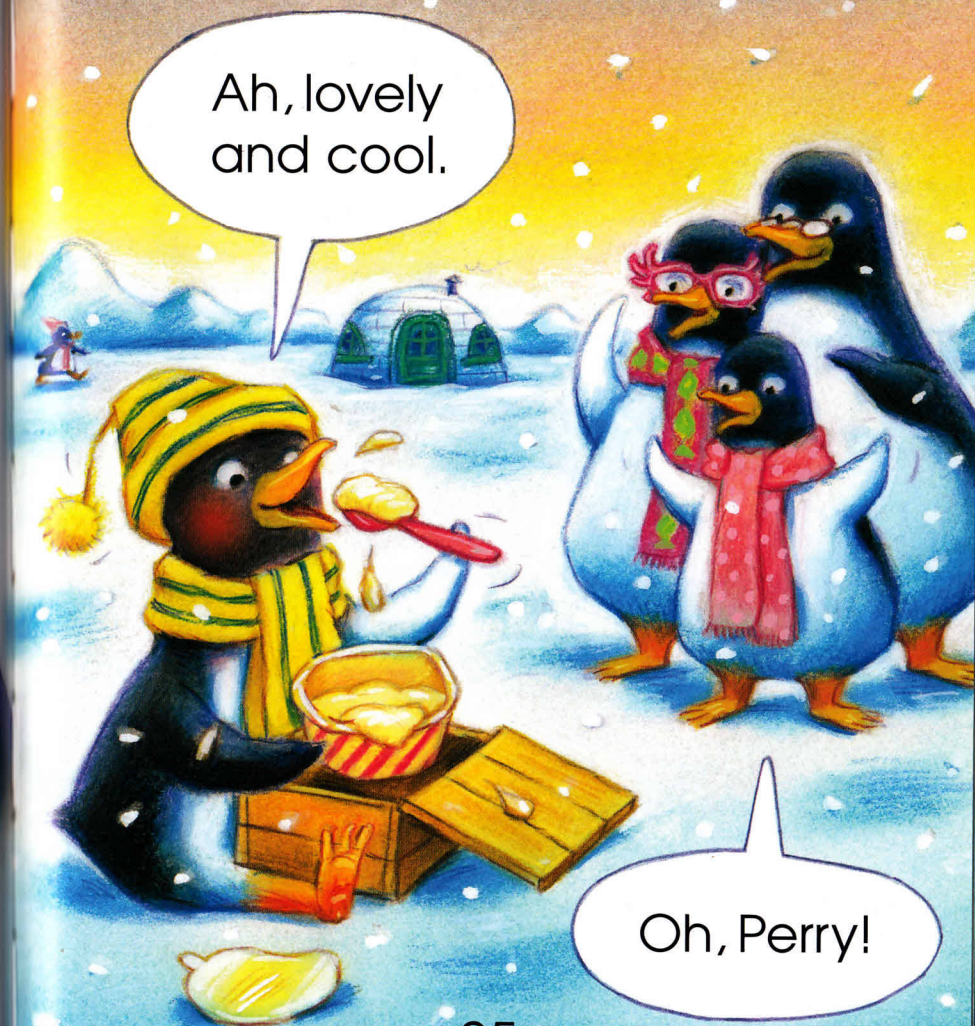

ice cream,” he said.

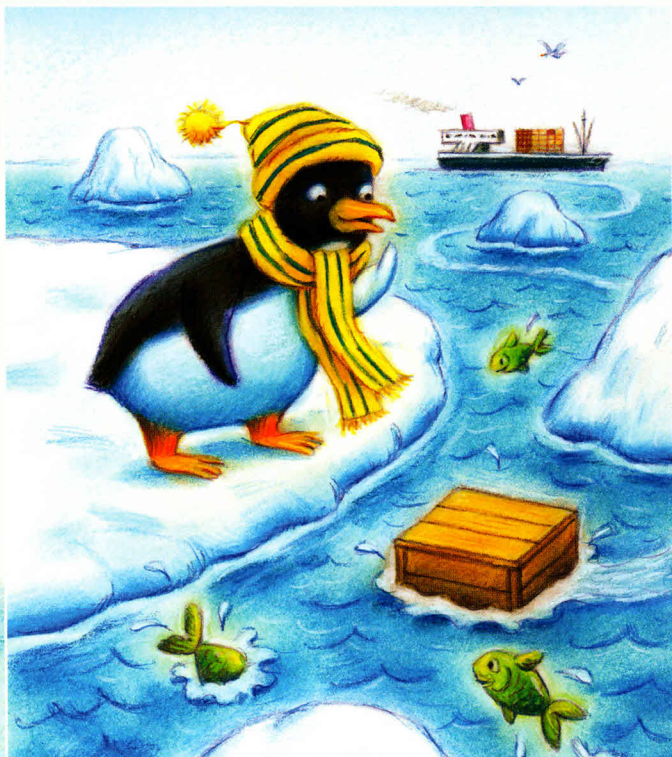




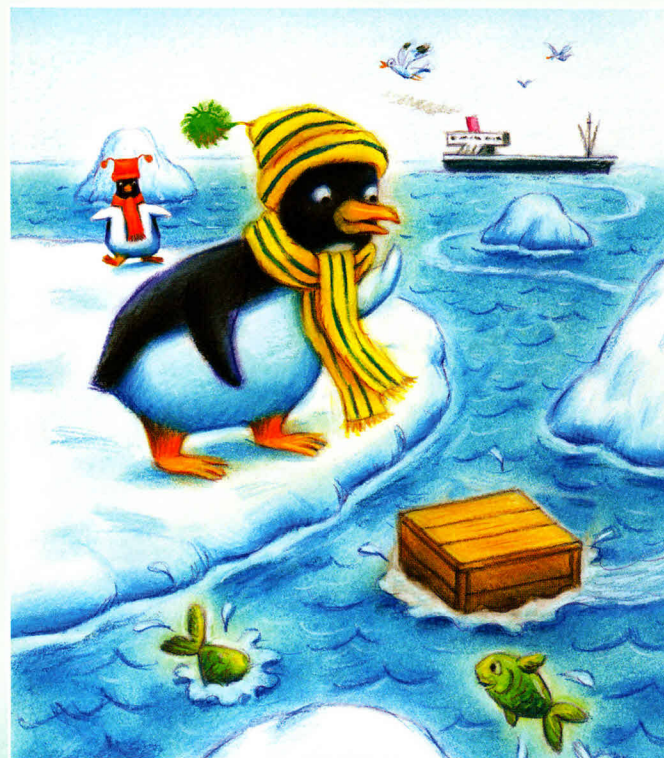
